Primary Regulatory Systems

- SDAT establishes ownership registration and entity status
- MDE regulates lead certification and environmental compliance
- Local jurisdictions administer rental licensing and inspections
- Maryland District Courts enforce lease agreements

Compliance Dependency Chain

- Incorrect ownership registration disrupts compliance records
- Lead certification issues can block rental license approvals
- Licensing failures delay eviction or rent enforcement cases
- — Missing documentation increases legal exposure

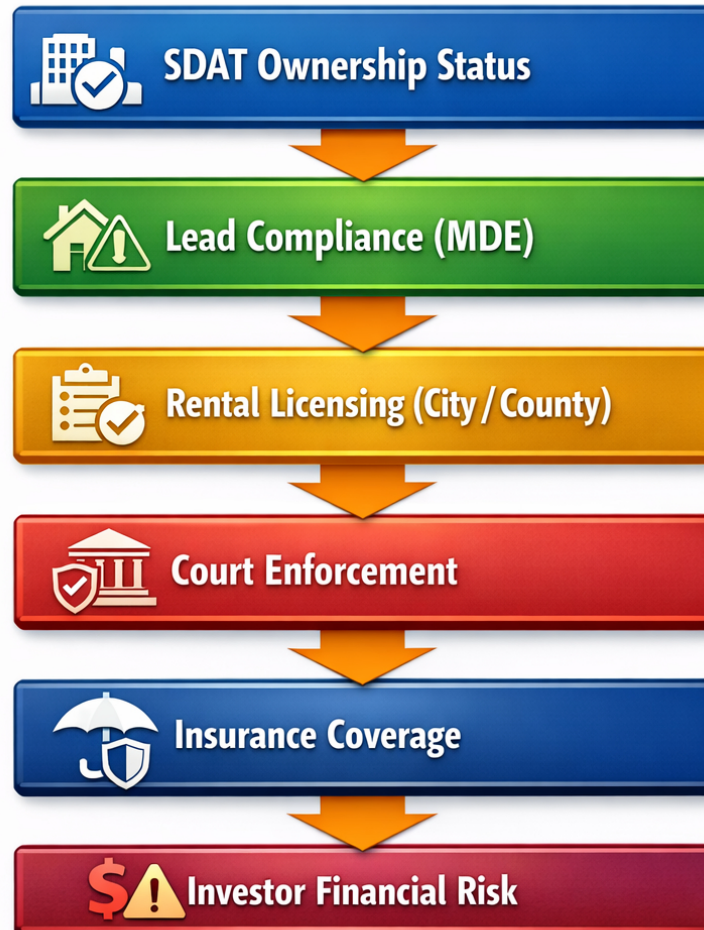
Rental Licensing and Court Enforcement

- Courts review rental license status in eviction cases
- Operating without a license can delay court filings
- Compliance documentation may be examined during disputes
- Accurate records preserve legal enforcement rights

Maryland rental property compliance involves multiple interdependent regulatory systems. Failures in ownership registration, environmental compliance, licensing, or documentation can cascade into legal and financial exposure for property owners.
